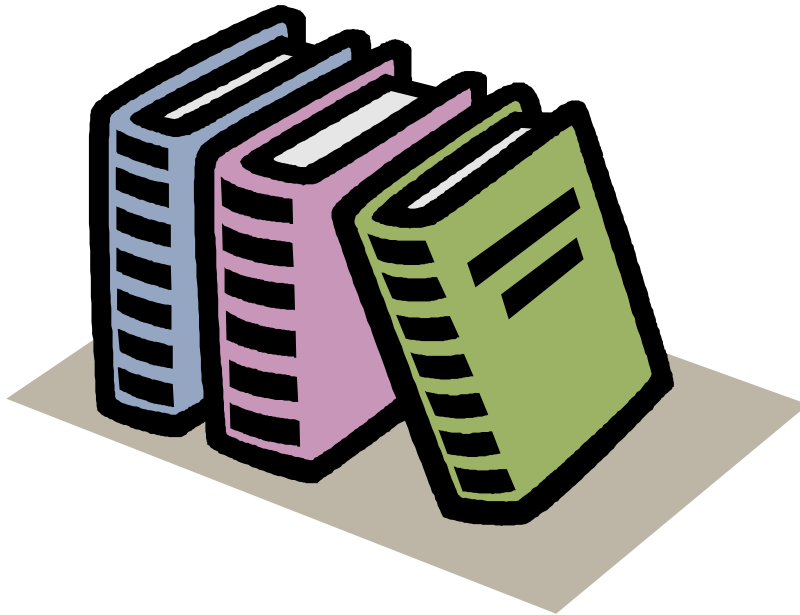

Dodge, Mary	<i>Hans Brinker, or, The Magic Skates</i>	Fascinating account of ice skating races on the canals of Holland
Doyle, Arthur Conan	<i>The Hound of the Baskervilles</i> <i>The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes</i>	The original, great detective stories
Dumas, Alexander	<i>The Three Musketeers</i> <i>The Count of Monte Crisco</i>	Adventures of dashing swashbucklers Unfairly imprisoned, the Count gets revenge.

Singer, Isaac Bashevis	<i>A Crown of Feathers and Other Stories</i>	A master storyteller who has preserved the Yiddish folk life in numerous tales
Smith, Betty	<i>A Tree Grows in Brooklyn</i>	A girl growing up in Brooklyn, dealing with family problems
Speare, Elizabeth	<i>Witch of Blackbird Pond</i>	A Caribbean girl befriends a strange old woman in colonial Connecticut.
Sperry, Elizabeth	<i>Call It Courage</i>	Young Polynesian boy must overcome his fear of the ocean to prove his worth to his villagers.

Townsend, Sue	<i>The Secret Diary of Adrian Mole, Age 13 and 3 Quarters</i>	Hilarious, irreverent tell-all
Thurber, James	<i>The 13 Clocks</i>	Hilarious modern fairy tale

A funny fantasy about traveling back in time to King Arthur's court The Prince wants a break, so he switches places with an identical commoner.
Verne, Jules	<i>20,000 Leagues Under the Sea</i> <i>Around the World in 80 Days</i> <i>Mysterious Island</i>	Great, old-fashioned adventures
Voight, Cynthia	<i>Homecoming</i> (series)	Abandoned by their mother, Dicey and her siblings walk and hitchhike to a new life.
Wangerin, Walter, Jr.	<i>Book of the Dun Cow</i>	A comic adventure about Chanticleer the Rooster
Watson, James D.	<i>The Double Helix</i>	A personal account of the discovery of DNA
Wells, H.G.	<i>The War of the Worlds</i> (other titles)	Science fiction about war against the Martians
White, E.B.	<i>Trumpet of the Swan</i>	A fantasy about a mute swan who uses his wits to overcome adversity
White, Terrence H.	<i>The Once and Future King</i> <i>The Sword in the Stone</i>	Young Arthur is tutored by Merlin the Magician and prepared to rule England. Only the future King of England can pull the sword from the stone.
Wibberly, Leonard	<i>The Mouse that Roared</i>	A small country with a big plan
Wiesel, Elie	<i>Night</i> <i>Dawn</i>	True stories of the author's experience in Nazi concentration camps
Wouk, Herman	<i>Marjorie Morningstar</i>	A beautiful Jewish girl growing up in NYC, in the 1950s

Wright, Richard	<i>Black Boy</i>	Autobiographical account of Wright's escape from the racist south
Wyss, Jonathan	<i>Swiss Family Robinson</i>	Life in the most famous of all tree houses
Yep, Lawrence	<i>Dragonwings</i>	Historical book about early Chinese immigrants
